Course Offerings

Coastal Christian High School encourages students to pursue the most challenging academic course work while still allowing them to fully engage in a healthy and robust high school community, including athletics, fine arts, and a vibrant spiritual life.

CCHS offers **standard**, **honors** and **AP level courses** across all departments, as well as dual enrollment opportunities through Cape Fear Community College and UNCW. Seniors are also invited to begin exploring career interests through year-long internships for hands-on, in-depth potential career experience.

J-Term Intensive: In January 2026, CCHS held the first J-Term session for two full weeks. This experience consisted of personalized, short-term career internships, experiential learning and service through a variety of mission & educational trips, both domestic and international. Additionally, many students participated in hands-on special interest courses ranging from Self-Defense, Cooking, Scuba Diving, Health Seminar, a look at our changing society through TV Time-Capsule, and much more. Each year will offer a new set of opportunities for Coastal students & staff.

Coastal Fine Arts Snapshot

CCHS has an exceptional Fine Arts program in both the performing and visual arts. Performing arts includes drama, honors instrumental ensemble, beginning choir, and three honors choirs. The performing arts groups work cooperatively across all areas in the program.
